Basic Skills: Letters

Print, laminate, and cut apart the dinosaur alphabet cards. Match uppercase and lowercase letters. Make self-checking by placing matching stickers on the back of each set.

Math: Count and Clip Cards


Print, laminate, and cut apart the counting cards. Count the objects on each card, and identify the correct number. Make self-checking by placing a sticker on the back of the correct number.



Math: Number Sense



DINOSAUR SENSORY BIN

What you'll need:

- white rice
- vinegar
- green food coloring
- small dinosaur toys
- sensory bin



What you'll do:

- First, pour two cups of rice into a gallon sized plastic bag.
- Next, add 2 tsp of vinegar to the rice.
- Then, add 20-30 drops of green food coloring.
- Finally, close the bag and mix well with your hands until the rice is evenly colored.
- Line a pan with paper towel.
- Pour rice onto paper towel, spread evenly, and allow rice to dry.
- Once the rice is dry, pour it into a sensory bin or tray. Add small plastic dinosaurs for sensory play.













What you'll need:

- crayons





What you'll do:


- Start by printing out the D is for Dinosaur craft template. If you want your kids to color the project, print the template on white paper. If they don't enjoy coloring, you can print the template on colored paper. Use several colored pages if they want a colorful dinosaur.
- Have your child cut out the template pieces. Glue the Letter D onto a sheet of construction paper. Then, add the head, tail, legs, and spikes to form a dinosaur.
- Take time to discuss the formation of the letter D and its beginning sound. Can your preschooler name other things that begin with the letter D?
- •Once the dinosaur is fully assembled, let your preschoolers decorate their dinosaur with crayons, markers, paint, or dot markers. Let them be as creative as they want as they create a one-of-a-kind dinosaur of their own.






Prepare the activity. Follow the directions on each activity.























































































































DINO DAY 4

Print pages. Have children follow the color code to complete the pages.



DINOSAUR TRACKS

What you'll need:

- paper plates
- washable paints
- plastic dinosaurs
- white construction paper



What you'll do:

- Introduce your dinosaur figures. See if there are any your child can name. Then, teach the names of the rest of the figures in your set.
- Next, pour your desired amount of paint onto a paper plate. You can use as many colors as you'd like to complete this project.
- Place the dinosaur feet into the paint.
- Press the painted dinosaur feet down onto the white construction paper and paint dinosaur tracks using different colors of paint.
- Repeat this process the desired amount of times using different colors and dinosaurs.
- Set aside painting to dry.

DIGGING FOR DINOS SNACK

What you'll need:

- 2 3.9oz pkgs chocolate pudding
- 1 pkg Oreos
- 1 pkg chocolate rocks candy
- 1 pkg gummy dinosaurs
- small clear plastic cups
- green colored coconut



What you'll do:

- Prepare pudding according to package directions and set in fridge for 20-30 minutes.
- Take the cookies apart and scrape off most of the white filling. Discard.
- •Crush the cookies until it looks like dirt.
- Set the cups out and start layering the ingredients. Add cookies, then pudding. Toss in some gummy dinosaurs and candy rocks.
- Repeat layers until the cups are full. Make sure you end with a little bit of dirt, gummies, and rocks.
- Sprinkle some green coconut in a few places to look like grass.
